Program Information:

Participants in this program will spend a month living and studying Communication in Florence, Italy; Munich, Germany; and Salzburg, Austria. Students will study Intercultural Communication while immersed in two of Western Europe's major cultural traditions: Tuscan Italian and Southern German. In addition, students will study Communication Ethics, with a special focus on Italian and German ethicists. These studies will be enriched by excursions to such important cultural and historical sites as the Barghallo Museum (Florence), Mirabell Palace (Salzburg), and the Dachau Concentration Camp (Germany). Florence, Munich and Salzburg are among Europe's most beautiful and charming sites. Each has a wealth of cultural, educational and recreational amenities, attracting students and scholars from around the world.
