## Program Information:

The two courses offered are Classics 121: Classical Greece, and Classics 122: Bronze Age Greece. The Classical Greece course is an introduction to the art, architecture, history and society of classical Greece through first-hand examination of major archaeological sites, visits to museums and lectures. The Bronze Age Greece course is an introduction to the art, architecture, history and society of Minoan and Mycenaean Greece through first-hand examination of major archaeological sites, visits to museums and lectures.

These courses apply to the major and minor in Classics and to the general education requirement in Humanities at the College of Charleston. Students meet for four two-hour orientation sessions during the Spring 2010 semester. The program includes visits to the principal archaeological sites in Athens and its environs, the Peloponnese, central Greece, Crete and Santorini. In addition to the well known archaeological site of Athens, the itinerary includes sites in Egina, Corinth, Nemea, Argos, Epidauros, Lerna, Tiryns, Mycenae, Dendri, Pylos, Bassae, Olympia, Delphi, Orchomenos, Thebes, Knossos, Phaestos, Ayia Triada, Lassithi, Mallia, Kato Zakro, Acrotiri, and ancient Thera.

Participants must be able to walk and climb along moderately difficult unpaved paths for long periods of time.
