ARTH 340: Art and Architecture in Italy

ARTH 340: History and Preservation of Italian Urban Design

Program Information:

This study abroad program will explore the Art and Architecture of Italy, as well as the History and Preservation of Italy's Italian Design. The program will begin with four days in Rome, where visits to museums and churches allows participants to not only see important works of painting and sculpture, but the architecture as well. From Rome, the program moves to Agropoli, a coastal village south of Salerno, and then onto the ancient Greek site of Paestum and to Roman Pompeii. Traveling north, the program moves to Florence, where participants will see unrivaled architecture and urbanism of the late Medieval and early Renaissance periods. A day trip to Siena is also planned. From Florence, the program then moves to Genoa, Pavia, and a day trip into Milan, the most important northern Italian city. Leaving Pavia, the program moves to Mantua, one of the most important Renaissance centers of Northern Italy. The program will conclude in Venice, where for four days and nights students will see the great works of Italian Gothic architecture, the church of San Marco, as well as the paintings and sculpture in the Accademia collection.

Dr. Russell is the Addlestone Professor in the Art History department at CofC, where he has taught since 1994. He has lived and travelled extensively in Italy and has taught courses in Italian art and architecture for the University of Georgia's Summer Cortona program and for the College of Charleston. This is the fifth occasion that he will offer these summer courses.
