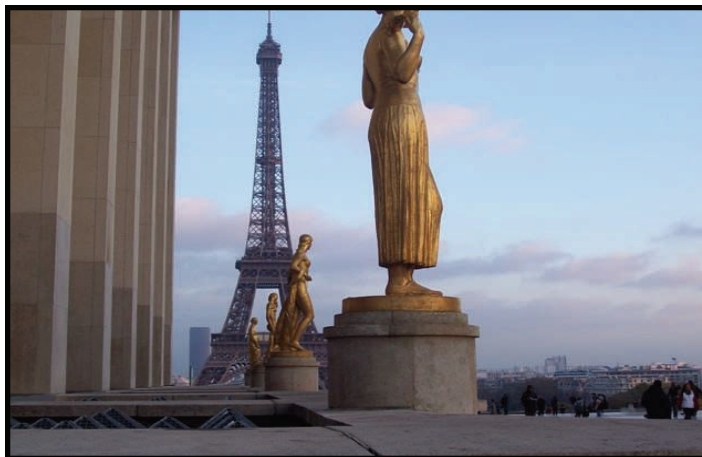

Topics: A History of Paris and its Architecture

Program Information:

The program will provide 6 credit hours, 3 hours in either FREN 313 or FREN 314 (French Conversation and Composition), and 3 hours in FREN 390 (Advanced Cultural Studies Abroad: A History of Paris and its Architecture). Students must take either FREN 313 or 314, depending on which of these two classes they have already taken, and the FREN 390 course. The FREN 313 or 314 courses will meet for daily conversation, based on assigned readings, and composition. The FREN 390 course, dedicated to a History of Paris and its Architecture, will also require daily readings and a completion of a term paper. Frequent trips to neighborhood historical monuments, sites, museums, etc. inside Paris, excursions outside Paris in the Ile de France region are also scheduled. Places such as Versailles, Saint-Denis, Vincennes and Fontainebleau, etc...
